Our Learning this Week

In phonics both groups have been reviewing our existing sounds, tricky words and high frequency words each session. Mrs Heywood/Mrs Richardson's group have been developing their understanding of CVCC words (consonant, vowel, consonant, consonant). They have been looking at polysyllabic words and incorporating them into their sentence work. Mrs Dodd's group have worked on CVCC words within Phase 4 and developed our sentence work ensuring correct letter formation. We have been learning all about 3D shapes and their properties. We have looked around the classroom and all around school. Lots of active learning.

We have a new member of our school family; Freddie has a new sister called Connie. We are absolutely delighted and it was lovely to see them on Wednesday morning.

Thank you to all our families who regularly read with their children. All our children have shown progress and they have grown in confidence. We really appreciate your support and it allows the children to read fluently and gain confidence.

As we have been learning all about 3D shapes, we would like you to go on a "fun shape hunt" for 3D shapes wherever you go over the weekend. Shapes are just about everywhere. We have focussed on cube, cuboid, sphere, cone, pyramid and prism. We will share these on the Thursday afternoon session.
