Our learning this week

We have been working hard on our handwriting this week and have been practising our best name writing. We have continued our phonics work this week with the diagraphs **th**, **ai** and **ee**. We have recapped the tricky words **go**, **no**, **l**, **to**, **the**, **into**, **we**, **me**, **be** and tried to write **no**, **go** and **to** from memory. We have revisited our sounds **s**, **a**, **t**, **p**, **i**, **n**, **c**, **d**, **m**, **o**, **g**, **k**, **e**, **u**, **r**, **g**, **ck**, **h**, **b**, **f**, **ff**, **ss**, **l**, **ll**, **j**, **v**, **w**, **x** and **y**, **z**, **zz**, **qu**, **ch**, **sh** and **ng**. We have also been using phoneme frames to help us break down and write cvc words. See if the children can remember how to draw one for you and try writing words like **pat** and **dog** or even one with a digraph such as **duck** and **ship**.

In maths, we have been talking about shapes and looking at their different properties, focusing on the language to describe them. The children have been encouraged to count corners and sides. We then looked at the 2D shapes we can see within some 3D shapes. We have also been decorating Christmas trees by adding 1 more or one less than a given number.

In P.E this week, we had a competition in teams. Mr Cairns set up different challenges where we had to gain as many points for our team as possible. We were throwing foam javelins, aiming beanbags, balancing and catching.

Forest School

On Thursday next week, it will be our turn for Forest School again. The children will need to wear plenty of warm clothes, as we will be outside. They will need to come to school in their own clothes but please make sure they are not wearing anything you're worried might get dirty. They will need to wear jumpers, coats, hats and gloves. A pair of wellies or old shoes would be a good idea; they will also need a pair of shoes for them to change into once we come back inside.
