As you may recall, during our Summer event we did not include a bar, this is because the rules around licencing mean that we can only have 499 people at an event if we want to have a bar if we just have a temporary license. The PTA committee took a decision that we did not want to be in a position where we had to turn people away, so instead we have been trying to apply to license the school site which would mean that this limit would not apply. In order to do this, we need to have a personal license holder who is prepared to be named as our Designated Premises Supervisor. If there are any parents or members of our school community that would be prepared to take on this role (there is no requirement to attend every event, but the person would need to act as our representative if the police or local government had any



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concerns, and would need to be contactable) please let us know - we would really appreciate this support in order to be able to offer a bar at our future events. If anyone has any legal experience and could help us to complete the license application, we would also be extremely grateful.
