Tokens: In order to make things simple and easy for everyone, we have decided to make most of our games/stalls cash free and payable with tokens. Collection for the Mid-Cheshire Foodbank

Over the last couple of years, we have been hugely successful in collecting for the Mid-Cheshire Foodbank. We made a massive donation of essentials, thanks to the good will and kindness of all our families and once again, the foodbank has made a call for help.

The generosity of our community is vital for the food bank, ensuring they can meet the ongoing demand for help. They give a household 5 days' worth of food including fresh fruit, vegetables and eggs (which are purchased weekly with monetary donations) but the cost of living crisis has seen a drop in donations and levels of stock in the warehouse have decreased.

We have decided once again to hold a collection at school to provide items for the Foodbank's Harvest Appeal (see attached flyer). This will take place from Tuesday 5th November to Friday 15th November. We will have trolleys available during the collection times for you to drop off donations; please avoid bringing items into the office or into school before the collection window opens. The trolleys will be outside Mrs Moore's Hall.
